This week we began the next phase of our staged return to 'at-school' learning: Phase 2

As outlined in the CEDP Term 2 Transition: A Framework, that was previously communicated to our community, the expectation is that most learning will still take place remotely and with a single mode of delivery during Weeks 3 - 5. This phase of transition to school saw the introduction this week of students attending school on designated days. Our plan involves students attending school aligned with their 'House colours.' At the same time we continue to support the 'essential workers' in our community, vulnerable teachers and teachers supporting remote learning of their own children.

It is anticipated that during Weeks 6 - 10, most learning will be delivered face-to-face. A further communication about arrangements for these weeks will be released in week 5.

We have been asked by some parents and carers if they are able keep their child at home on a day when onsite attendance is available and to continue with remote learning. In this regard we respect parent choice. Students can continue to follow their remote learning timetable. These students will be marked as attending (flexible) if they engage with remote learning and complete learning tasks.

Parent and Carers are reminded that students are to be dropped off and picked up from the parish carpark. Teachers on duty will supervise student's entry to and exit from the school site. I also stress that social distancing protocols must be exercised by all community members at all times.

Posters outlining the protocols are displayed in the carpark area. These protocols will remain in place until we are advised otherwise by CEDP and Government authorities.

I ask our parents and carers to support our school in maintaining a healthy work environment for both students and staff. Please keep your child at home if they have any of the following symptoms: cold, runny nose, cough, temperature or a general feeling of being unwell. Please be aware if a child presents at school with a fever parents and carers will be contacted to collect their child from school. Clearance from a doctor should be obtained for the child to return to school.

This is a gentle reminder to our families that students returning to school must wear their **full winter uniform**. If you are not aware of the dress code and the school's expectations in regards to grooming I refer you to the uniform policy on St John's website. Some parents have advised the school that they have been unable to purchase the girls winter dress and tights. Today we have been advised by Lowes that a delivery of uniforms is expected in the next week. Girl's tights can also be purchased from Big W and Target.

Tips for parents and caregivers

Some tips from the Department of Education

Through everyday activities and play situations children will naturally use numbers. Young children are very capable of sharing out things such as lollies so that each person has a fair share or adding a friends' collection to his or her own and finding the total. We need to help children discover quick and easy ways of using numbers.

How do children learn to use numbers? When first learning to use numbers, children will need to have the objects with them in order to add, subtract, multiply or share equally (divide). They will go through a process of needing to see and count each thing, one at a time. We need to help children learn to start counting from a larger number and add or subtract a second number. We also need to help children build mental images of a group or quantity so they do not always have to rely on seeing the objects. Helping children to mentally "see" groups of things will also help them with understanding multiplication and division before they learn the "tables".

What can you do at home?

- Play board games such as Snakes and Ladders with two dice and encourage your child to add the two numbers rolled. Show them how to count from the larger number.
- Play card games such as 21 or bust. In this game, two cards are dealt to each player who adds the numbers together. Each player may ask for more cards from the "kitty" with the aim of being the person with the highest score that does not go over 21.
- Ask your child to help you work out how many more items are needed when you are shopping. I have six apples here, how many more will I get to make ten?
- Look at house numbers when going for a walk. Ask your child to guess what the next number will be.
- Go for a drive and point out the signs that indicate the distance to the next town. In the country the numbers on the kilometre signs go down by 5. Ask your child to work out what number will be on the next sign.
- Ask your child to share out items fairly with others.













